In July 2006, Jo Wyrick became the first woman to serve as Executive Director of the [National Stonewall Democrats](#) (NSD), the only national organization of gay, lesbian, bisexual, and transgender Democrats.

"There are few national organizations willing to place serious resources in states like South Carolina and South Dakota," said Wyrick. "However, we are finding partners within Democratic and LGBT groups who understand that a long-range vision of equality must include a substantial investment within these communities. Winning political victories a decade from now means seeding new efforts today."

Before joining National Stonewall Democrats, Jo previously served as Executive Director of Equality North Carolina and as a Senior Field Organizer with the Human Rights Campaign. Jo is a native of Greensboro, North Carolina, a graduate of the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill, and Jo resides in Germantown, Maryland with her partner Amy and their daughter Elizabeth.

"The electoral success of our local chapters now allows our national organization to press Democratic leaders to further support our families through proactive policy," said Wyrick. "National Stonewall Democrats is the vehicle for our community to continue to improve the record of the Democratic Party on LGBT issues while helping our allies win elected office."

Jo Wyrick pressed NSD to develop grassroots programs benefiting rural LGBT communities alongside an increase in organizing efforts in traditional urban areas. Stonewall expanded its national membership efforts, created new chapters and increased resources delivered to these chapters. Stonewall also developed a strong focus on connecting grassroots activists with local and state Democratic parties, resulting in an increase in the number of candidates and parties supporting full marriage equality for same-sex couples. NSD now boasts more than 90 local chapters across the country. In 2004, NSD launched the Stonewall Young Democrats with a focus on growing LGBT Democratic activism on college campuses.

**Biology of Sexual Orientation Subject of Talk  
at The Center Project**

*Are people born gay?* Actor Bill Oberst Jr. steps out of character to examine the surprising science behind that question on March 22, 7:00 pm at The Center Project, 307 Highway 15, Myrtle Beach. The public is invited to attend and admission is free.

Oberst, who performs in theaters and colleges across the country, spent a year researching the subject for his play, "Xq28." The science fiction script envisions a future in which one's sexual orientation can be changed through genetic therapy, but Oberst's presentation "In His Image" sticks strictly to the facts. "While writing the play, I became engrossed in the world of genetics and the search for the biological origins of sexual orientation," he says. "Research on the topic only started in the 1990's and much is not yet known, but what has been discovered is truly striking." Oberst will discuss the known, the unknown and the still-in-question, using the latest scientific research findings. He'll also put things into historical context by looking at how science and sexual orientation have intersected in the past.

**About Bill Oberst Jr.**

Oberst is well-known to church audiences for his portrayal, "Jesus of Nazareth," and to secular ones for his recreations of notable men of history like Mark Twain and John F. Kennedy in their own words. "In His Image" is his latest project. He plans to present it to church and civic groups across the South.
