Federal Ruling Protects Kids of Gay Parents

Should the legal ties between parents and their adopted child unravel if the family leaves the state where the adoption decree was handed down?

But that's what Oklahoma lawmakers were striving for in 2004 with their chillingly titled "Adoption Invalidation Law," which targeted adopted children with gay parents. The statute declared that Oklahoma would refuse to recognize "an adoption by more than one individual of the same sex from any other state or foreign jurisdiction." In other words, if a gay couple and the child they adopted in, say, California or Maryland moved to Oklahoma or simply drove through Oklahoma on vacation, they would not be treated as a legally recognized family by any Oklahoma official -- whether a police officer, public school teacher or judge.

Sounds un-American, doesn't it? It's also unconstitutional. That's what a federal court of appeals told Oklahoma on Aug. 3 in striking down the law. A panel of three judges -- all of them Republican appointees -- of the 10th Circuit Court of Appeals agreed with a lower court ruling that Oklahoma's anti-family law violated the U.S. Constitution's Full Faith and Credit Clause, which requires states to honor one another's judicial judgments, including adoptions. Late last week, the Oklahoma Department of Health decided not to fight the ruling.

The 10th Circuit's sensible ruling comes as states -- where nearly all family law originates -- are getting more used to gay families. About 250,000 U.S. children are being raised by gay parents. Those families' rights vary greatly from state to state. Courts in most states allow gay couples to jointly adopt or allow a gay adult to become the legal second parent of a partner's child.

Adopted kids deserve to feel every bit as secure as their playmates. Now, their parents can breathe easier, knowing the Constitution is on their side.

AFFA Small Grants Program

Alliance for Full Acceptance is again offering [small grants](#) to lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, queer and questioning youth (LGBTQQ) projects throughout 2007. Legally recognized 501 (c)(3) organizations (or those with a qualified fiscal agent) serving North and/or South Carolina youth are welcome to apply.

Now in its fourth year, the AFFA Small Grants Program encourages grants that address the multitude of issues LGBTQQ youth face as they "come out" and seek to become empowered people and leaders in their community. Grants will be made with full participation from community youth representation. Grants will not exceed \$3,000 for the year per organization. The \$3,000 maximum award may come in either one grant, or multiple smaller grants within the 12 month period. A Grant Application is enclosed.

Examples of requests might include but are not limited to: supporting Gay Student Associations, travel money for students to attend rallies or lobbying days, purchasing needed books or materials, technical support, such as a training or a facilitator of a strategic planning process.

Organizations will be given priority if they have demonstrated youth involvement, ability to plan and measure goals, fiscal responsibility, collaboration, development of leadership and emotional health and self esteem in LGBTQQ youth.

AFFA will review grant requests as they are submitted. Organizations will be notified within 30 days of submission date. Please submit both an electronic copy and hard copy of the proposal to AFFA.

Monies for the AFFA [Small Grants Program](#) are provided through a generous grant by the Freeman Foundation.

The grants are available until the funds are gone, Apply now.
